

Congress For People, KCR For Kin: CM Revanth

Warangal: Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Sunday said that if the BRS was voted back to power, only the family of its president K. Chandrashekar Rao would benefit. People of the state would continue to gain under a Congress government, he said. “KCR believes in family justice while we believe in social justice,” Revanth Reddy said.

Addressing public meetings at Mulugu and Parkal after participating in development initiatives, the Chief Minister also dared BRS working president K.T. Rama Rao and former minister T. Harish Rao to bring Chandrashekar Rao to the Assembly for the session scheduled in September

to debate on the contribution for people’s welfare by the BRS and Congress governments. “The glaring contrast between KCR and I is that he only worked to further the political and financial interests of his family and a particular section of society,” Revanth Reddy alleged. “In contrast, the Congress government and I have been relentlessly working for people’s welfare.”

Revanth Reddy was reacting to the two BRS leaders’ claims of development during the BRS regime and allegations of failure against the Congress government. “Let us debate the matter in the Assembly and leave it to people to decide,” the Chief Minister said.



Elaborating on the contrast of appointments from different sections of society, the Chief Minister said Chandrashekar Rao had inducted Rama Rao and Harish Rao into his Cabinet but the Congress had given ministerial posts to

two women — Danasari ‘Seethakka’ Anasuya and Konda Surekha. “KCR made E. Dayakar Rao a minister, and the Congress made Adluri Lakshman a minister. Kavitha was made MP, and MLC after losing the election, but the Congress

ensured that Kadiyam Kavya was elected MP and Yashaswini Reddy a legislator.”

“The father gifted the party working president post to the son during the BRS regime and the Congress made

Mahesh Kumar Goud the PCC president. KCR gave a Rajya Sabha ticket to his nephew while I, following the dharma of friendship, made Vem Narender Reddy an MP,” Revanth Reddy noted. “A close relative, Vinod, was appointed Planning Commission deputy chairperson after he lost the Lok Sabha polls, but the Congress honoured Prof. Kodandaram with an MLC seat for his contribution to the Telangana movement.”

On welfare initiatives, the Chief Minister said the Congress government had waived farm loans of Rs 21,000 crore, extended Rs 36,000 crore under Rythu Bharosa, farm assistance, and spent Rs 30,000 crore to-

wards free power to the farm sector. Besides, farmers were given bonus for growing fine variety of paddy, he said. He also promised that the Congress government would make every effort to provide employment and livelihood opportunities to the youth.

Skills, industries and jobs, Revanth Reddy said, would remain priorities as Telangana’s future depended on its younger generation. “Don’t fall into the trap of the BRS leaders who failed to make a single appointment to government jobs for a decade and are now instigating the youth. You just focus on competitive exams because the government is coming up with more recruitment,” he said, addressing the youths.

‘Dimagi Naxal’ Remark Sparks BJP-Oppn War of Words

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s reference to “dimagi Naxals” in his Independence Day address triggered a war of words between the BJP and the Opposition on Sunday, with Union minister Kiren Rijiju clarifying that the Prime Minister was not referring to Opposition leaders but to those who support Maoists and separatists and reject the Constitution.

Addressing the nation on the 80th Independence Day on Saturday, Modi warned that while “armed Naxals may have gone”, “dimagi (intellectual) Naxals” continued to operate within the system and influence policies. He called for identifying and isolating them.

Opposition leaders criticised the remarks, alleging that they were aimed at stigmatising dissent and targeting those who questioned the government.

Seeking to clarify the Prime Minister’s remarks, parliamentary affairs minister Rijiju said on X that Modi “didn’t say Opposition leaders” were “dimagi Naxals”.

Rijiju said the description applied to those who supported Maoists and rejected the Constitution, backed separatists and Article 370, and those who wanted to “cut chicken neck to separate North-East from India”.

His last comment was an apparent reference to jailed



activist Sharjeel Imam, who faces charges under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act in connection with the 2020 northeast Delhi riots case.

Congress spokesperson Pawan Khera took a swipe at Rijiju for numbering the three points as “1, 2 and 4”. “Brother Kiren Rijiju, get your counting

right first, then we’ll answer. After 1 and 2 comes 3, not 4,” he said.

Congress leader Jairam Ramesh joined in, commenting, “Entire Political Science’s kamaal.”

Earlier, senior Congress leader P. Chidambaram had posted: “I am proud to be a dimagi Naxal”, drawing sharp reactions from BJP leaders.

BJP MP Ravi Shankar Prasad termed Chidambaram’s remark “utterly irresponsible”. He said Modi’s reference was to people who, while sitting in cities such as Delhi, Mumbai, Patna and Kolkata, allegedly nurtured Maoist ideology and provided ideological and other support to the movement.

BJP spokesperson Sambit Patra also attacked Chidambaram, alleging that Naxalism had prospered when he was home minister during the UPA government.

BJP MP Nishikant Dubey posted an old video of Chidambaram discussing India’s nuclear weapons policy and asked whether the remarks qualified him as a “dimagi Naxal”.

BJP national general secretary (organisation) B.L. Santhosh and the party’s IT department head Amit Malviya also targeted Chidambaram over his remarks as the political row over the Prime Minister’s Independence Day comments intensified.

AP Leads States in AI Skilling With 1.08 Lakh Job-Ready Youth

VIJAYAWADA: Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu’s technology-led push is helping Andhra Pradesh build one of the country’s largest pools of certified talent in emerging technologies.

In a significant achievement, the state has recorded the highest number of candidates completing AI and Big Data Analytics (BDA) certification courses under the Centre’s FutureSkills PRIME programme.

According to data furnished by the Union Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) in the Lok Sabha on August 12, as many as 1,53,783 candidates in Andhra Pradesh were enrolled or trained in AI and

BDA over the past three years. Of these, 1,08,895 candidates have completed training or secured certification, placing Andhra Pradesh at the top among all states in terms of AI/BDA candidates completing certification programmes.

The figures underline the growing scale of the state’s technology-skilling ecosystem, with the emphasis shifting from mere enrolment to creating a job-ready talent pool in technologies expected to drive the next phase of the digital economy.

The AI and BDA numbers are part of a wider FutureSkills PRIME footprint in the state.

Andhra Pradesh has



recorded more than 4.34 lakh candidates enrolled or trained across the programme, including over 2.13 lakh candidates in AI and BDA.

FutureSkills PRIME, a MeitY initiative imple-

mented in partnership with NASSCOM, focuses on skilling, reskilling and upskilling youth in emerging technologies. Its industry-aligned courses cover areas including artificial intel-

ligence, big data analytics, Internet of Things, cyber security, blockchain and augmented and virtual reality.

The programme has

witnessed significant participation nationally, with more than 34 lakh registrations, 23 lakh enrolled or trained candidates and 13 lakh candidates completing training or certification. Around 86 per cent of the participants are from Tier-2 and Tier-3 cities, highlighting the programme’s role in taking advanced technology skills beyond major IT hubs.

For Andhra Pradesh, the growing certified talent base is expected to strengthen the state’s ability to attract investments and generate high-value employment in emerging technology sectors. It also provides a potential workforce for the state’s ambitions to de-

velop Visakhapatnam as a technology and AI hub and build Amaravati as a modern, technology-driven capital.

Naidu has consistently positioned technology and innovation as key drivers of economic growth, while electronics minister Nara Lokesh has been promoting investments, emerging technologies and high-value employment opportunities.

With more than one lakh candidates already completing AI/BDA certification under FutureSkills PRIME, Andhra Pradesh is seeking to convert its expanding technology talent base into a major economic advantage in the emerging AI and quantum technology landscape

INDIA’S INNOVATION CHALLENGE REMAINS

Though India has emerged as one of the world’s largest producers of scientific publications and patent filings, it continues to lag behind in research spending relative to the size of its economy. One of the reasons for this poor performance, compared with other major economies, is that R&D spending has traditionally been the exclusive domain of the public sector since independence, and the private industry was largely insulated from innovation. However, a positive shift is happening now. The latest report by the Department of Science and Technology on India’s research profile reveals a major milestone. For the first time in the country’s history, private industry’s share of the Gross Expenditure on Research and Development (GERD) stood at 51.8% in 2023-24, overtaking the combined spending of the central and State governments. This significant jump from 45.5% in 2021-22 is a welcome development. According to the Economic Survey 2025-26, India’s GERD stands at roughly 0.64% of GDP — a figure that has been virtually stagnant for more than a decade and is dwarfed by those of Israel (5%), South Korea (4.8–4.9%), the United States (3.5%), Japan (3.3%), and China (2.4%). The R&D spending hovered in the range of 0.6% to 0.85% for nearly 20 years despite India’s economy growing several-fold. The optics of private industry crossing the 50% threshold are encouraging, and they do bring India structurally closer to advanced economies where business enterprise typically funds 70–80% of national R&D. South Asians & Diaspora

While the private sector’s rising R&D share is a positive and necessary correction to India’s historically state-dominated research funding model, it is by itself not sufficient to close the technology gap with the countries it wants to compete with. India crossing the 50% mark in private contribution while spending less than 1% of GDP on R&D is a very different achievement from the US or China doing so while spending 2.5-3.5% of GDP. Understandably, private R&D follows sectors that promise near-term commercial returns: generic and specialty pharmaceuticals, IT services and software products, automotive components and EVs, and consumer-facing digital technologies. These sectors are undoubtedly important for boosting exports and generating employment, but they are not fully aligned with the areas most consequential for India’s strategic autonomy and long-term economic security: semiconductor fabrication, advanced materials, critical minerals processing, defence and aerospace systems, foundational AI models, and clean energy storage. A large share of private R&D is concentrated in a narrow set of sectors. Decades of a protected, import-substituting economy, followed by a services- and IT-outsourcing-led growth model, meant Indian firms could compete and profit without deep in-house research — unlike Korean or Chinese firms, which were pushed by export-oriented industrial policy. Also, public research institutions and private industry have historically operated in separate silos, with limited co-funded research or faculty-industry mobility, unlike the tightly integrated innovation ecosystems of the US or Germany.

Telangana: SIR Will Serve Notices to 21% Digitised Voters Today

Hyderabad: The Hyderabad district election authority (DEA) will serve notices on 5.82 lakh electors, accounting for 20.83 per cent of the 27.95 lakh digitised enumeration forms, after the draft electoral roll under the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) 2026 is published on Monday, August 17. The notices will be issued to electors whose details furnished in the voter enumeration forms could not be mapped or linked with the SIR 2002 electoral rolls.

In Hyderabad district, of the 43.76 lakh names in the electoral rolls, 27.95 lakh enumeration forms, or 59.01 per cent, have been digitised under SIR 2026. Another 19.41 lakh names, or 40.99 per cent, have been placed in the Absentee, Shifted and Dead (ASD) category.

Out of 27.95 lakh digitised forms, 5.82 lakh electors will receive notices as their mapping details could not be found.

The highest number of unmapped electors is in the Secunderabad Cantonment Assembly constituency at 66,471, followed by Jubilee Hills with 63,448 and Musheerabad with 58,321.

Most of the 5.82 lakh electors either did not fill in the column seeking details from the 2002 electoral rolls or had anomalies, including discrepancies in names and age, in their enumeration forms.

Mapping or linking is part of the electoral roll purification process under SIR 2026, under which the election authority seeks to identify a present elector in the 2002 records or link the elector



through family lineage.

If the authority is unable to find an elector's name in the 2002 electoral roll, the names of the elector's parents are checked. If the parents' names are also not found in the 2002 roll, the elector is marked as unmapped.

The notices seek details relating to the 2002 electoral rolls. If an elector did not have voting rights in 2002, details of one of the parents in the 2002 rolls have to be submitted. If neither criterion is met, the elector has to submit any of the 12 identity documents relating to date and place of birth accepted by the Election Commission of India (ECI).

Notices will be served by booth-level officers (BLOs), BLO supervisors or other election officials, who may contact electors over the phone and hand over physical notices. In some cases, electors may have to collect the notices from the BLO, while in others they will be delivered at their residences.

Issuance of notices will be followed by verification, during which election officials will collect supporting documents to establish the elector's electoral history. As all enumeration forms were collected even when details were incomplete, the exercise is intended to identify electors or their parents in the earlier rolls and correct discrepancies.

Failure to map an elector's details does not by itself mean that the name will be deleted from the electoral roll. The claims and objections period will begin with publication of the draft roll

on August 17 and continue until September 16. Disposal of notices, claims and objections will continue until October 15, followed by publication of the final electoral roll on October 19.

The 19.41 lakh names placed in the ASD category will not appear in the draft roll to be published on August 17. Such electors will have to submit Form 6 again, which will seek details about the earlier electoral rolls. Tribunals have not been set up in Telangana at present. Scrutiny of notices and the final decision will rest with the Electoral Registration Officer (ERO) concerned.

H-City Project: Rs.1,090 Crore Plan to Ease Traffic Around KBR Park

Hyderabad: The Telangana government has launched the Hyderabad City Innovative and Transformative (H-City) project to curb the rapidly growing traffic congestion in the metropolis and upgrade its transport infrastructure to international standards.

As part of the initiative, the government has commenced construction of 14 major structures, comprising seven multi-level steel flyovers and seven directional underpasses, at six key junctions around KBR Park with an estimated budget of Rs.1,090 crore.

To ensure smooth, uninterrupted, and rapid completion of these construction works for early public utility, a one-way traffic system will be implemented around KBR Park starting August 18.

Speaking about the implementation of the one-way system, Hyderabad City Police Commissioner V.C. Sajjanar, IPS, said the measures were being introduced to minimise



inconvenience to commuters while significantly reducing the construction timeline. He said the decision was taken after comprehensive studies, two rounds of trial runs and close coordination with the GHMC to address ground-level challenges.

"Once these multi-level structures are completed, traffic issues at KBR Park Entrance, Road No. 45, Film Nagar, Maharaja Agrasen, and Cancer Hospital junctions will be 100% resolved, ensuring signal-free travel. At the heavily congested Jubilee Hills Check Post Junction, travel bottlenecks will be reduced by 80%. As a result, travel time between the core city and the IT corridor will be significantly minimized, saving fuel worth crores of rupees," Sajjanar said.

Sajjanar further said that reducing prolonged vehicle idling at traffic junctions would help lower carbon emissions around KBR Park and contribute to environmental protection.

The commissioner explained that

commuters may experience initial inconvenience due to route changes following the August 18 one-way implementation; this temporary measure is crucial for completing construction on schedule and securing smooth travel for future generations.

"Temporary one-way traffic is for long-term benefit. We request all commuters, local residents and citizens to extend their full cooperation to the Police Department during this project," he said.

Sajjanar also said the police department was in continuous consultation with local residents, morning walkers and resident welfare associations (RWAs) in the KBR Park area, adjusting traffic plans dynamically to avoid inconvenience.

The Commissioner appealed to city residents to cooperate with the authorities in implementing the project, which is aimed at providing a permanent solution to traffic congestion in the KBR corridor.

World Sailing Championship Medalist Felicitated

KAMAREDDY: Adviser to the state government Mohammed Ali Shabbir said that winning a silver medal at an international championship was a matter of great pride and described Rishwita Sunchanakota, who won a silver medal at the World Sailing Championship in Italy, success as an inspiration to Telangana's youth, particularly aspiring sportspersons.

Revanth Offers Prayers At Medaram, Launches Welfare Schemes

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy offered special prayers to Goddesses Sammakka and Saralamma at Medaram in Mulugu district on Sunday. Amid traditional rituals and drum beats, priests welcomed him at the sacred gaddes, where he offered jaggery equivalent to his height as a customary offering.

Revanth Reddy prayed for the welfare, prosperity and good health of the people of Telangana. He inspected development works underway at the shrine and planted a sapling on the temple premises, stressing the importance of environmental protection.

The Chief Minister inaugurated a water treatment plant to provide clean drinking water to devotees visiting Medaram. He also launched the distribution of new social security pensions, handing over sanction letters and cheques to 24 widows and single women under the rural development programme. Each beneficiary will receive ₹2,016 per month. He said the government would ensure that all eligible people benefit from welfare schemes.

Revanth Reddy interacted with women devotees and enquired about the benefits they were receiving, particularly the free bus travel facility.



He later met self-help groups, discussed their livelihoods and financial empowerment, and posed for a group photograph with them.

Meanwhile, panchayat raj minister Danasari 'Seethakka' Anasuya tied a Rakhi to the Chief Minister at Medaram in advance of Raksha Bandhan on August 28, as he is expected to be on a foreign tour at the time.

The Chief Minister arrived by special helicopter from Bichkunda and was accorded a warm welcome by ministers, MPs, MLAs, public representatives and officials. Tribal priests in traditional attire received him with drum beats. PCC president Mahesh Kumar Goud, ministers

Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy, Seethakka and Adluri Laxman, MPs Vem Narender Reddy, Kadiam Kavya and Balaram Naik, Government Whip Ramchander Naik, MLAs Kadiam Srihari, Gandra Satyanarayana Rao, Nayini Rajender Reddy and others attended the programme.

Kalyana Lakshmi scheme row: BRS to stage protests across Telangana



Hyderabad: Charging that the Congress government was hatching a conspiracy to scrap the Kalyana Lakshmi scheme, BRS working president KT Rama Rao called upon party leaders and activists to stage protests across the State on Monday.

He accused the Congress government of deliberately trying to discontinue the scheme under the guise of a High Court verdict. Rama Rao asked party leaders to stage protests at constituency and mandal headquarters to thwart what he called the conspiracy and expose the Congress party's deceit. He made the remarks during a teleconference with party MLAs, MLCs and others, on Sunday.

The BRS working president said the Kalyana Lakshmi and Shaadi Mubarak schemes were not merely welfare programmes but initiatives deeply linked to the self-respect of women from poor families.

BRS chief K Chandrashekhara Rao launched the schemes on October 2, 2014, shortly after the formation of Telangana. Initially, Rs. 51,000 was offered under the scheme. The amount was later increased to Rs. 1,00,116.

During the BRS tenure, financial assistance of Rs. 13,000 crore was provided to nearly 13 lakh women. The Kalyana Lakshmi scheme was also continued during the COVID-19 pandemic, he said.

"The Congress party promised to provide

'tulam' gold (10 grams) in addition to Kalyana Lakshmi, but attempts are being made to scrap the scheme," Rama Rao said.

He charged that beneficiaries were being denied the benefits and made to wait for long periods. In some cases, beneficiaries were forced to make repeated rounds of government offices even after their children had been born, he alleged.

Similarly, the distribution of cheques for applications approved after long delays had also stalled, he said. Rama Rao demanded that the government immediately process all pending eligible applications and release the financial assistance.

"Why did the government fail to file a counter-affidavit despite being granted four extensions? The government pays huge sums to private lawyers to argue cases involving issues like corruption but has acted negligently regarding the Kalyana Lakshmi scheme," Rama Rao said.

He alleged that the Congress government was determined to completely halt the Kalyana Lakshmi and Shaadi Mubarak schemes under the guise of the High Court verdict.

He warned that if the schemes were cancelled, the women of Telangana and their families would teach the Congress government a fitting lesson. Geographic Reference

Rama Rao asked the BRS cadre to confront Congress leaders in every village and ward and conduct extensive campaigns among the public. He said this would make people question Congress leaders.

BRS demands recall of smart food cards, CAG audit into Rs 100-crore spend

Hyderabad: After the Congress government launched the distribution of smart food security cards, the Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) termed the initiative a cheap party campaign and demanded that the cards be recalled. It also sought a Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) audit of the exercise. Downloading Interactive

In a sharp attack, BRS MLC Dasoju Sravan condemned what he called a criminal waste of Rs. 100 crore in public funds under the guise of distributing 1.05 crore laminated PDS ration cards. The cards were launched on August 15 across 119 constituencies.

He said the expenditure came at a time when Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy was claiming financial helplessness in clearing long-pending fee reimbursement dues for impoverished students and pension as well as gratuity benefits for retired employees.

Over Rs. 100 crore was spent to replace active e-cards with glossy, laminated cards carrying oversized portraits of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy and Civil Supplies Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy, he alleged. Nearly Rs. 100 was spent on each card, factoring in cloud servers, specialised web portals, printing, lamination and logistics across 33 districts. He charged that the entire



exercise amounted to a waste of taxpayers' money.

In 2021, Congress leaders, including Priyanka Gandhi, took to the national stage to denounce Prime Minister Narendra Modi's photograph on CoWIN vaccination certificates. They had described it as a "disgusting abuse of public funds for personal PR during a humanitarian crisis".

The Election Commission subsequently ordered the removal of the Prime Minister's photographs during State elections in Goa, Uttarakhand and elsewhere. Sravan questioned why the same moral standard was not being applied to Revanth Reddy and Uttam Kumar Reddy.

"Food security under the National Food Security Act (NFSA) is a statutory, constitutional right and not a personal feudal charity disbursed from the pockets of Congress Ministers," Sravan said.

The BRS MLC maintained that by displaying the Civil Supplies Minister's portrait alongside that of the Chief Minister, the Congress government had openly flouted the Supreme Court's orders.

He said that once the Model Code of Conduct came into force for the impending local body or GHMC elections, the Election Commission would inevitably freeze or order the reprinting of the 1.05 crore cards. This, he said, would force taxpayers to bear another Rs. 100 crore as a penalty for what he described as the government's reckless narcissism.

The BRS demanded that the photographs of the Chief Minister and Civil Supplies Minister be removed from all ration cards. It also sought the reissue of standardised PDS cards bearing only the official State Emblem. The party further demanded a CAG audit of the approximately Rs. 100-crore procurement, printing, server setup and lamination contracts. It sought recovery of the allegedly squandered public funds directly from the authorities responsible

Congress leaders occupy front row, Collector pushed back in Sangareddy event

Sangareddy: Congress government has been humiliating the district collectors by ignoring the protocol during the official meetings organised at government expense. Following the protocol of meetings at district level, the Collectors must be made to sit in the first line even during the Chief Minister's and Ministers meetings organised by the government departments.

He must be given priority after the Chief Minister, and Ministers unless any senior IAS officer attends the meeting. However, the Sangareddy Collector Prateek Jain was

made to sit in the second row during the Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy's public meeting held at Ambedkar Stadium on Saturday.

While Prateek Jain was sitting in the second row, Congress leaders like T Jagga Reddy, A Chandrasekhara and several other leaders, who were holding no protocol positions, were made to sit in the first row. Shockingly, Revanth Reddy, his cabinet colleagues Uttam Kumar Reddy, D a m o d a r a Rajanarasimha and G Vivekananda did not even utter Prateek



Jain's name even though he and his team worked for a week to make arrangements for the programme.

While the programme was organized at the expense of the civil supplies department, Congress leader Jagga Reddy, his wife Nirmala, son and daughter stole the show.

Naidu Says Modi's Viksit Bharat, AP's Swarna Andhra Complementary

VIJAYAWADA: Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu on Saturday called upon the 5.5 crore people of Andhra Pradesh to collectively resolve and transform the state from development to prosperity, making AP a leading state of India by 2047.

Addressing the 80th Independence Day celebrations at Amaravati after unfurling the National Flag and receiving the ceremonial salute, the CM said freedom enjoyed by Indians is a result of decades of struggle and sacrifices by countless freedom fighters. He urged people to think about what they could contribute to the nation, though individual achievements are also part of nation-building.

"Let us work with nationalistic spirit and patriotism and make the country and Andhra Pradesh number one by 2047," Chandrababu Naidu said, calling for sustained efforts over the next 20 years. He said Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of a Viksit Bharat and the state's Swarna Andhra goals are complementary.

The Chief Minister declared that the previous government had pushed the state 30 years back through arrogance, inefficiency, corruption, and anarchy, weakening institutions and damaging the economy. The coalition government had taken up the task of rebuilding the state and had brought visible change in 26 months, he maintained.

Naidu asserted that the NDA alliance government is steering AP from destruction to development, crisis to stability, and uncertainty to confidence. The state's growth rate had risen to 11.3 per cent, while debt restructuring of 370 loans has helped save `8,269 crore in interest burden. In 26 months, `1.50 lakh crore have been spent on welfare and `1.34 lakh crore on development.

The AP CM said the state government has filled 15,941



teacher posts despite hurdles to the Mega DSC. He promised to conduct DSC recruitment every year, pointing out that a job calendar with 10,000 posts has already been released this year.

Naidu mentioned that 28 new industrial policies have been introduced and agreements have been signed for investments worth `24 lakh crore. Approvals have been given for industries worth `14 lakh crore, which are expected to generate 11 lakh jobs. Foreign direct investment has increased six-and-a-half times in two years.

Naidu said nearly `25,000 crore have been spent on irrigation projects in 26 months. An irrigation calendar has been issued to complete 36 major projects at a cost of `35,000 crore over the next three years. 89 per cent of Polavaram works have been completed and the project would be dedicated to the nation before the Pushkarams next year. Vamsadhara-Nagavali River-Linking Project is 73 per cent complete, while the Veligonda

Phase-I works would soon fulfil a 30-year-old dream.

The CM spoke about Greenfield ports at Ramayapatnam, Machilipatnam, and Mulapeta progressing rapidly, while modern fishing harbours are being built at Juvvaladinne, Nizampatnam, Machilipatnam, and Uppada. The state has `64,000-crore worth railway works and `38,000-crore worth highway projects under execution. Amaravati, being developed as a blue-green, deep-tech, carbon-neutral, and pollution-free global city, would symbolise the self-respect of the people of AP.

Naidu said the state government is working towards women's economic empowerment by marketing their products under the Swayam brand. Tourism had been accorded industry status, attracting `19,390 crore in investments in two years.

The Chief Minister underlined that every farmer would receive `20,000 under Annadata Sukhibhava, while modern technology is being introduced in agriculture. State government is planning to develop Rayalaseema into a horticulture hub with an investment of `1 lakh crore and establish an Indian School of Agriculture.

Naidu underlined that the government has adopted "people first" governance, strengthened public safety, and given police the freedom to act against crime. The Eagle Task Force is cracking down on ganja and drugs, he stated.

Earlier, contingents of APSP, CRPF, Karnataka Police, NCC, and Scouts participated in the parade and presented a ceremonial salute. Government departments showcased colourful tableaux highlighting development initiatives.

The CM later presented police medals to officers and personnel for distinguished service.

Eligible Families Must Get Welfare Benefits, Ineligible Beneficiaries Must Be Checked

Smart Ration Cards Launched | 3,14,308 Cards Issued | Minister Tummala Calls for Welfare Benefits to Reach the Eligible | Focus on Education and District Development

KOTHAGUDEM | AUGUST 15, 2026: State Agriculture, Co-operation, Marketing and Handlooms Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao directed officials to ensure that government welfare benefits reach every eligible poor family. He made it clear that eligible beneficiaries should not be left out and ineligible persons should not continue receiving free welfare benefits.

Speaking at the Smart Ration Card distribution programme held at Kothagudem Club on Saturday, the Minister said, "Do not leave out the eligible and do not provide free welfare benefits to the ineligible." He appealed to those who are no longer eligible for food security benefits to voluntarily return their ration cards to the government.

The Minister said the government was giving top priority to food security and providing six kilograms of free rice per month to every member of eligible families. He said quality fine rice was being supplied to ensure that genuine poor families receive proper food security.

Focus on Education

Minister Tummala said the government was taking steps to establish Young India In-



tegrated Schools across all constituencies in the district. He stressed the importance of quality education for children from poor families and said Ekalavya, Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas and Gurukul schools were providing quality education to poor and tribal students.

Development of Bhadradi Kothagudem

The Minister said Bhadradi Kothagudem district had immense potential in natural resources, forests, tribal culture, industries and agriculture. He called upon public representatives to work together for the comprehensive development of all five constituencies.

He said 7420 crore had been sanctioned for the Kothagudem bypass road. He also said efforts were being made to establish an airport after examining the identified site and preparing a feasibility report.

A new national highway connecting Kothagudem with Hyderabad had also been sanctioned, while the Pandurangapuram-Malkangiri railway line would further strengthen railway connectivity in the district, he said.

3,14,308 Smart Ration Cards Issued
