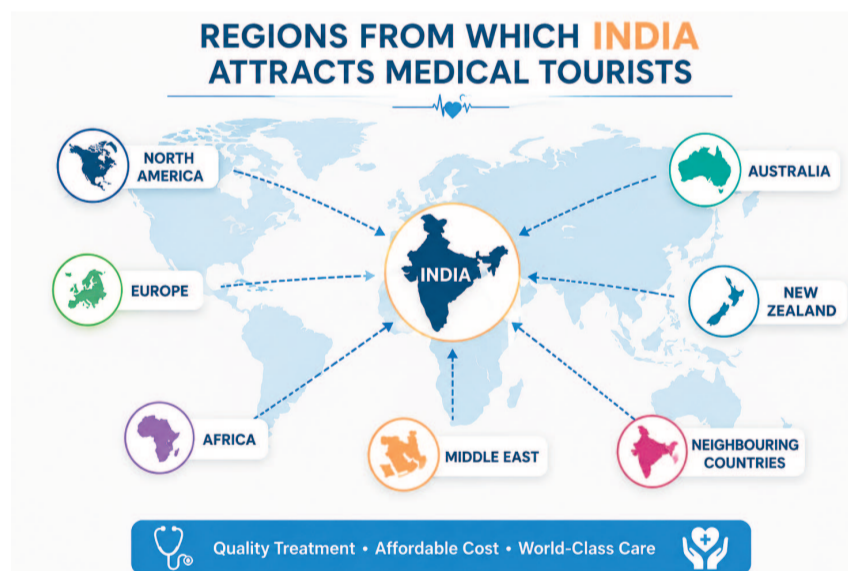

## India Emerges Medical Tourism Hub

New Delhi, July 1: India is rapidly establishing itself as a leading global destination for medical tourism, attracting patients from North America, Europe, Australia, New Zealand, Africa, the Middle East, and neighbouring countries, according to a report released on Wednesday. The report by Awaaz attributes this growing appeal to India's affordable healthcare, internationally accredited hospitals, highly skilled doctors trained at premier global institutions, and access to advanced medical technologies. It noted that many complex medical procedures in India cost significantly less than comparable treatments in countries such as the United States, the United Kingdom, Australia, and New Zealand, making the country an attractive option for international patients. 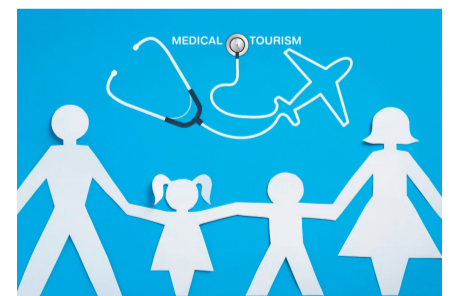

## EDITORIAL

## Development Without Deforestation

Forests are far more than collections of trees—they are the foundation of ecological balance, climate resilience, biodiversity, and the livelihoods of millions of people. At the same time, developing nations like India require new roads, railways, industries, renewable energy projects, and urban infrastructure to sustain economic growth. The challenge, therefore, is not choosing between forests and development but ensuring that development does not come at the irreversible cost of environmental destruction. India has witnessed rapid infrastructure expansion in recent years. Highways, mining projects, industrial corridors, hydropower plants, and urban expansion have created employment opportunities and improved connectivity. However, many of these projects have also led to deforestation, habitat fragmentation, and displacement of wildlife. The consequences are becoming increasingly visible through rising temperatures, declining groundwater levels, human-wildlife conflicts, and more frequent floods and landslides. These environmental costs often outweigh the short-term economic gains. Forests perform invaluable ecological services that cannot be easily replaced. They absorb carbon dioxide, regulate rainfall, prevent soil erosion, conserve water resources, and support thousands of plant and animal species. They are also home to indigenous communities whose culture and livelihoods are closely linked to forest ecosystems. Protecting forests, therefore, is not merely an environmental obligation but an economic and social necessity.

Development projects are essential, but they must be planned responsibly. Environmental impact assessments should be transparent, scientifically rigorous, and free from undue influence. Projects should avoid ecologically sensitive areas whenever feasible, and compensatory afforestation should focus on restoring natural ecosystems rather than merely planting trees. Native species, biodiversity conservation, and long-term monitoring must become integral parts of environmental planning. Technology can help strike this balance. Satellite imagery, Geographic Information Systems (GIS), drone surveys, and artificial intelligence can identify environmentally suitable project locations while minimizing ecological damage. Sustainable construction practices, green infrastructure, and renewable energy solutions can further reduce environmental footprints without slowing economic progress. Equally important is involving local communities in conservation efforts. Forest-dwelling populations have traditionally protected natural resources through sustainable practices. Empowering them through participatory forest management, eco-tourism, and livelihood support can strengthen conservation while promoting inclusive development.



## Amazon Faces Lawsuit Over Prime Video Ads

Sydney, July 1: Amazon is facing legal action in Australia after introducing advertisements on Prime Video and requiring subscribers to pay an additional fee for an ad-free experience. The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) has filed a case in the Federal Court, alleging that Amazon included unfair terms in its Prime subscription contracts and used them to introduce advertisements without properly compensating customers. According to the ACCC, more than 1 million annual Prime subscribers were affected between November 2023 and August

2025. The dispute stems from Amazon's 2024 decision to add advertisements to Prime Video. Customers who had already prepaid for an annual Prime membership suddenly received an ad-supported version of the service. Those wishing to continue watching without advertisements were asked to pay an additional A\$2.99 (about ₹170) per month. At the time the change was introduced, over 850,000 Australian subscribers had already paid A\$79 upfront for an annual Prime membership. The ACCC argues that Amazon effectively downgraded the service for existing subscribers while

charging extra to restore the original ad-free experience. It also alleges that Amazon relied on five unfair contract clauses that allowed it to make significant changes to Prime services without providing refunds or compensation. The regulator is seeking financial penalties, customer compensation, legal costs, and other orders against Amazon. Responding to the lawsuit, Amazon Australia said it is reviewing the case in detail and has cooperated with the ACCC throughout the investigation. Prime Video had been offered as an ad-free streaming platform for more than a decade as part of Amazon

Prime, which also includes shopping benefits, faster delivery, and entertainment services. Amazon launched Prime in Australia in 2018 and began introducing advertisements on Prime Video across several countries in 2024.

## GST Collections Up 14% in June

New Delhi, July 1: India's gross Goods and Services Tax (GST) collections increased by 13.9 per cent year-on-year to Rs 1.95 lakh crore in June, reflecting strong economic activity and higher tax revenue from imports. According to official data, gross GST collections stood at Rs 1,94,812 crore, compared to Rs 1,71,105 crore in June last year. GST revenue from imports surged 34.6 per cent to Rs 60,038 crore, while domestic GST collections rose 6.5 per cent to Rs 1,34,774 crore. After refunds, net GST collections grew 11.2 per cent to Rs 1,62,377 crore. During the April-June quarter of FY27, gross GST revenue increased 8.4 per cent to Rs 6.32 lakh crore, indicating steady growth in tax collections.

## Nayara Cuts Fuel Prices

New Delhi, July 1: Private fuel retailer Nayara Energy has reduced petrol prices by Rs 5 per litre and diesel prices by Rs 3 per litre across its network of more than 7,000 fuel stations nationwide. The revised prices came into effect on July 1, though rates may vary by state due to local VAT. The price cut follows a decline in global crude oil prices after tensions in West Asia eased, improving crude supply and lowering international oil prices. The move coincides with a reduction in commercial LPG cylinder prices and revisions to export duties on petroleum products. However, there is no change in excise duty or retail prices of petrol and diesel supplied for domestic consumption.

**Mbappe Leads Golden Boot Race**

France captain Kylian Mbappe continued his sensational FIFA World Cup campaign by scoring twice in France's 3-0 win over Sweden, setting a new record for the most goals in World Cup knockout matches. The brace took Mbappe's tally to six goals, moving him ahead of Lionel Messi in the Golden Boot race on assists. His overall World Cup goal count also rose to 18, just one behind Messi's all-time record of 19 goals. France will next face Paraguay in the Round of 16, with Mbappe looking to extend both his scoring record and lead in the race for the tournament's Golden Boot.

**Mexico Ends 40-Year Wait**

Mexico City, July 1: Co-hosts Mexico ended a 40-year FIFA World Cup knockout-stage drought by defeating Ecuador 2-0 in the Round of 32 at the iconic Azteca Stadium, securing a place in the Round of 16. The match, delayed by an hour due to heavy rain and thunderstorms, saw Mexico take control in the first half. Julián Quiñones opened the scoring in the 22nd minute, while Raúl Jiménez doubled the lead in the 31st minute, sealing a memorable victory. The win marks Mexico's first knockout-stage triumph since the 1986 FIFA World Cup, when they defeated Bulgaria 2-0 in the Round of 16 during the last World Cup hosted by the country. It also ends the nation's long-standing struggle to progress beyond the opening knockout round. The 2026 FIFA World Cup, expanded to 48 teams, introduced a new Round of 32, providing Mexico with the opportunity to rewrite history. Mexico entered the tournament determined to bounce back after suffering a group-stage exit at the 2022 FIFA World Cup, their earliest elimination since 1978. Four years later, the hosts have emerged as one of the tournament's strongest contenders. Ecuador's hopes faded further when defender Piero Hincapié was shown a red card in stoppage time (90+5'). Despite the defeat, Ecuador impressed throughout the tournament, notably defeating Germany in the group stage to qualify for the knockout phase.



**Rain Washes Out Opener**

Chester-le-Street, July 2: Persistent rain washed out the opening T20I between India and England after India posted a competitive 189/7, denying fans a thrilling run chase as not a single ball was bowled in England's innings. After electing to bat, India suffered an early collapse, losing Sanju Samson (1) and Ishan Kishan (0) within the first two overs to slump to 6/2. Young opener Abhishek Sharma turned the game around with a blistering 59 off 24 balls, smashing 6 fours and 4 sixes at a strike rate of 245.83. He shared an 82-run partnership with skipper Shreyas Iyer, who anchored the innings with a composed 68 off 47 deliveries. Following Abhishek's dismissal, Tilak Varma contributed 13, while Shivam Dube provided the late acceleration with an unbeaten 42 off 21 balls, striking 2 fours and 3 sixes. India eventually finished on 189/7 despite losing Harshit Rana (0) and Axar Patel in the closing stages. For England, Saqib Mahmood was the standout bowler, claiming 3/33, while Sam Curran and Adil Rashid picked up one wicket each. England were expected to chase the target with a strong batting lineup featuring Jos Buttler, Philip Salt, and Harry Brook, but heavy rain during the innings break prevented any further play. Repeated inspections failed to improve conditions, forcing match officials to declare the contest a no-result.

**Ishan Kishan Tops T20I Rankings**

Dubai, July 1: India wicketkeeper-batter Ishan Kishan has become the world's No.1 T20I batter, replacing teammate Abhishek Sharma in the latest ICC Player Rankings. Kishan climbed to the top after his impressive performances at the T20 World Cup, ending Abhishek's nearly one-year stay at No.1. In the Test rankings, Australia's Travis Head achieved the No.1 batting ranking for the first time in his career, while India's Jasprit Bumrah regained the top spot among Test bowlers. Several New Zealand players also made significant gains in the latest rankings following their victory over England, while India's Shivam Dube moved up to seventh in the T20I all-rounders' rankings.

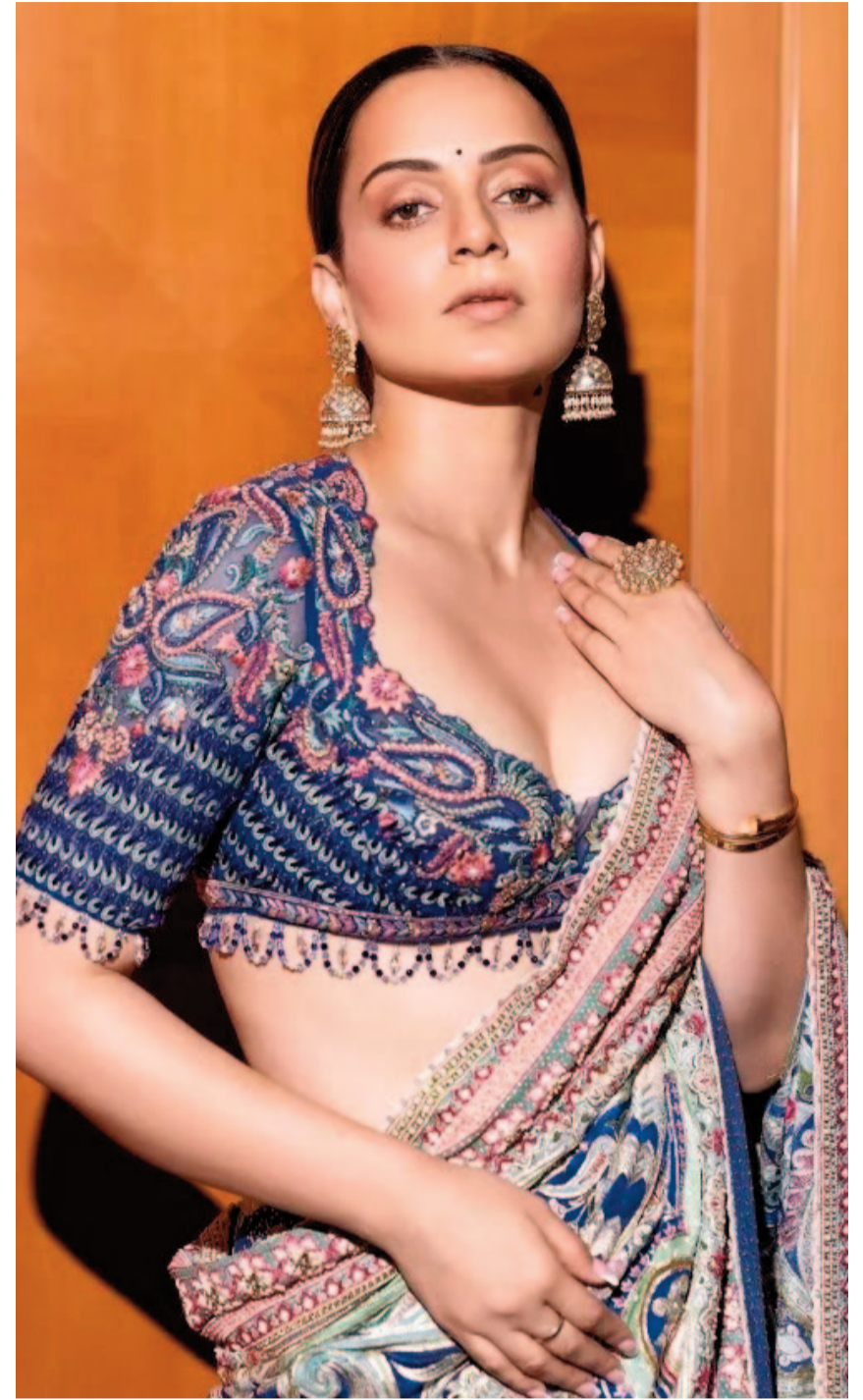
